SUCCESS STORY

DESTINATION: FAMILY

The goal of our Destination Family program is to help youth, like Jason*, achieve permanency despite the odds. Jason and his four sisters endured a chaotic home marked by substance abuse and domestic violence. In 2011, all five of them were removed from their home and placed into protective care.

Though their home life had been traumatic, they found comfort in being together. Unable to find one caregiver/family to take them all in, they were separated from the only support system they had ever known.

For several years, Jason lived in foster care, separate from his sisters. Fortunately, Sandy, his oldest sister, was reunified with an extended family member and found some stability. At 19 years old, Sandy was determined to provide that same stability for Jason, by reunifying with him and becoming his legal guardian. However, Sandy faced some roadblocks with the child welfare system. Sandy's attempts to bring Jason into her home were stalled because she was determined to be too young and unable to raise both Jason and her young daughter. She was heartbroken, and Jason was close to losing hope. He'd been in the foster care system for six years, living in a group home, and struggling.

During this chaotic process, a SSYF social worker from the Destination Family program entered the picture. After spending time with Sandy, the social worker was able to advocate for her and Jason. Sandy's strengths were highlighted, such as strong organizational skills, high level of responsibility, and success at maintaining a full time job, while continuing her education. After a year of continued efforts and advocacy, Jason was able to reunify with his sister.

Three years later, Jason is now a proud, loving uncle to two little nieces, and last month, right after his sixteenth birthday, he officially and legally became part of this big, beautiful, forever family.

PERMANENCY





DESTINATION FAMILY

No child is "unadoptable." Our program goal is to achieve legal permanency for youth in foster care who have one or more barriers to adoption, including those who may be medically fragile, ethnically diverse, teenagers, or part of a sibling set.

The Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption funds two Wendy's Wonderful Kids Recruiters to find adoptive homes.



PERMANENCY PLACEMENT UNIT

Our Permanency Placement Unit recruits, trains, and supports families who want to transform the lives of children in foster care by providing the love, safety, and unconditional commitment of a forever family.



WONDER MENTORING PROGRAM

Our Wonder Mentoring program ensures no child has to go through foster care alone, by matching children one-on-one with caring, consistent adults for a minimum of a year-long journey in the arts, music, sports, and nature.



PERMANENT FAMILY CONNECTIONS (FOSTER CARE)

All of our foster care programs and adoption services are focused towards permanency - a permanent connection to a safe, stable, and nurturing family for every youth. Our programs utilize concurrent planning, which provides several paths for youth to obtain a lifelong family connection. The first and best option is to reunify the youth with their birth family. At the same time, we work to identify a family who is willing to make a lifelong commitment to the youth, if reunification is not possible.

MENTAL HEALTH

FLEXIBLE INTEGRATED TREATMENT (FIT) & COMMUNITY BASED FAMILY SERVICES (CBFS)

Through these specialized mental health programs, our community's underserved youth and their families become empowered to lead their lives more fully. We focus on tangible outcomes for youth and their families that build on their strengths and successes, increase resiliency, reinforce family connections, and improve overall mental and behavioral health.

FAMILY PRESERVATION AND THERAPEUTIC SUPPORT SERVICES

Trained therapists provide individual, family, and group therapy, including comprehensive mental health services, with the goal of nurturing and strengthening families.

WRAPAROUND & WRAPAROUND PREVENTION

Our Wraparound program literally "wraps" youth and families with comprehensive care to help keep youth safe and at home, in school, and out of trouble. Young people and their families gain the support and guidance of our Wraparound program to help them remain at home or transition safely to a permanent family. The program combines a family-centered, strengths-based, needs-driven, team-driven approach with individualized and wellness-focused interventions. Our approach is comprehensive and outcome-driven; a sometimes unconventional response to complex family needs to ensure the best outcome for youth. The goal is for youth to become stable and live in a healthy family setting.

THERAPEUTIC BEHAVIORAL SERVICES

A powerful program for youth with intense behaviors that put the youth at risk to of losing placement. The program stabilizes the child's placement, identifies triggers, and teaches the youth coping skills.

SCHOOL BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES


Our school services provide therapeutic interventions to students through both in-person and virtual environments. We provide individual and group services along with consult to teaching staff on managing difficult behaviors in the classroom setting.

We serve about 70 students in two schools, one of which serves students across the state.



FAMILY AND YOUTH PARTNERSHIP

Family Partners and Youth Advocates ("peer supports") offer their own personal experiences and advocacy skills as a valuable layer of support to the youth and families in all of our programs. The goal is to empower youth and ensure families have "voice and choice" in service delivery.



JUVENILE JUSTICE CRIME PREVENTION (JJCP)

JJCP provides Functional Family Therapy (FFT) - a short-term, family based prevention and intervention program for youth on probation who are at risk of violence, substance abuse, delinguency, other behavioral issues, and family relationship challenges. The program focuses on family strengths to help build positive relationships and promote community safety.

Youth that have experienced trauma are at high risk for:

- Substance abuse
- Mental health issues (such as depression and suicide)
- Promiscuity
- Criminal behavior
- Dropping out of school

SUCCESS STORY

A WORLD OF WONDER

Wonder matches children in foster care with caring, consistent adults like Jackson who accompany the child on a journey in the arts, nature, sports, cultural events, and other activities. As the mentor repeatedly shows up and demonstrates stability, the child begins to experience relationships as a source of joy, meaning, and support.

In 2017, Juan* was 10 years old and living in foster care. Early childhood trauma had profoundly affected his ability to trust and form healthy relationships.

In June of that year, Juan was introduced to Jackson, an adult volunteer mentor in the Wonder Mentoring program (Wonder). Jackson serves as a mentor because he believes strongly that every child deserves to grow up knowing that they matter and that someone cares about them, no matter what.

Juan and Jackson have had many amazing experiences such as attending baseball games, watching Harlem Globetrotters, and indoor rock climbing. With all of the experiences together, they have developed a bond. Juan is able to talk to Jackson, and Jackson is there to listen.

Through the Wonder program and his relationship with Jackson, Juan has grown into a remarkable young man who gives back to his community. Juan finds value in easing the pain of others. For three years now, he and Jackson have purchased clothes and food for people who are homeless.

Earlier this year, Jackson introduced Juan to a program at the local library where children read stories to service dogs. The dogs are calmed by the steady voices of young people and the kids love petting and interacting with the dogs. Sadly, Juan's foster family faced their own challenge when their dog, Ellie, became terminally ill. Even through his own sadness, Juan managed to understand that Ellie was in pain and that letting her go peacefully was the right thing to do. The next morning, Juan's foster mom discovered that he had been up all night reading to Ellie. When Jackson, the mentor, learned of this, he was overcome with emotion, "That a child who has been through so much has developed such a deep capacity for love and kindness brings tears to my eyes," Jackson said. "I'm so grateful to be a part of his journey."




It is through this program that youth like Juan experience the joys of mentorship.









